2008-2009 Annual Report of Activities

1-Regular meetings, lectures

The Student Chapter meets twice a month to organize its activities including field trips, short courses and scientific conferences. Minutes of the meetings are prepared by the secretary and are archived with the academic sponsor.

2-Field trips

On November 28th 2008, eight members of the Université Laval - INRS SEG Student Chapter went to the Niobec underground mine, Saint-Honoré, in the region of Saguenay Lac-St-Jean. Niobec contributes 7 to 8% of the world production of niobium. The majority of the niobium is produced in open-pit mines of IAMGOLD. This substance is predominantly used in steel production (superalloys, medicine, etc.). The visit was very instructive for the students who visited underground and surface operations.

From May 3rd to May 13th 2009, seven members of the Université Laval – INRS SEG Student Chapter visited mineral deposits in the area of Minas Gerais, Brazil. The group had a local geology lecture, visited a total of eight mines and two geology museums. In Belo Horizonte, Professor Carlos Alberto Rosière of the Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais (a university that also has a SEG Student Chapter), gave a lecture about the regional geology of the Minas Gerais area, paying special attention to the Quadrilátero Ferrífero. The first mine the chapter visited was the Belmont Mine, situated North-East of Belo Horizonte, which exploits emerald. The Student Chapter had a brief presentation of the company and then visited the open pit, underground mine the processing plant. Afterwards, the group visited Cuiabá underground gold mine owned by AngloGold Ashanti, located in the Quadrilatero Ferrifero. The group visited the mine shortly after blasting. They experiment the safety conditions in Brazil, which are different from those in Canada. After, the Student Chapter visited three iron mines of Vale: Águas Claras, Capão Xavier, and Mutuca mines, located near Ouro Preto. The group also visited an Alcoa bauxite mine, located in Poços de Caldas.

3-Organization of conferences, workshops, short courses

Since a couple of years, during the *Québec Exploration* mineral exploration conference and trade show, the Université Laval – INRS SEG Student Chapter is holding a short course, presenting various aspects of mineral deposits exploration. The 2008 (November 23rd-24th) short course was on geochemistry of magmatic Ni-Cu-(PGE) deposits such as Sudbury, Noril'sk, Raglan, Bushveld and Stillwater. The short course instructors were professors C. Michael Lesher (Laurentian University) and Sarah-Jane Barnes (Université du Québec à Chicoutimi), who are international experts on those types of deposits.

Québec Exploration is a popular convention attended by more than 2000 delegates that is usually held during 4 days and is a must-attend event for all mining exploration shareholders and

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investors in eastern Canada. Conferences are held during the event and it's a nice opportunity to meet and share the latest developments in the mineral exploration industry.

4-Participation in conferences, workshops, short courses

On April 22nd 2009, during the *Journée des Sciences de la Terre et de l'Environnement* (JSTE), was held various presentations of graduate students. The SEG Student Chapter sponsored the activity and awarded a prize of 100\$ for the best presentation of mineral deposits.

5-Fund-raising programs

The Université Laval - INRS-ETE Student Chapter fund-raising programs are designed to sponsor the Student Chapter activities, in particular the fieldtrips. The revenues from the *Québec Exploration* short course are returned entirely to the Student Chapter. This is a major source of funding (8 800\$ in 2008). The short-course given by Michael Lesher and Sarah-Jane Barnes, during the *Québec Exploration* convention, contributed greatly to the Chapter fund. The Chapter also solicit mining and exploration companies to sponsor its activities. In 2008-2009, the Student chapter received 750\$ from Agnico-Eagle and Aurizon Mines, despite numerous sollicitations. This was a particularly appreciated support in a period of economic downturn. The Chapter also received sponsorship from university student associations; CADEUL and AESGUL. The fund of the "Office Québec-Amérique pour la jeunesse" sponsored 70% of the flight tickets for the Brazil field trip. Finally, the Student Chapter held a meet-and-greet/fund-raising night at a local pub, during the same week.

6-Future plans

The Student Chapter has recruited, in 2009-2010, 31 local members so the future is promising for upcoming activities.

First, the Student Chapter will organise again this year the short-course during *Québec Exploration 2009*. The short course subject is recent developments in exploration geophysic. Different geophysical methods will be discussed in relation to discovery of various mineral deposit types. The course instructors are Professor Michel Chouteau (École Polytechnique) and Michel Allard (Xstrata Zinc).

Second, the Student Chapter is planning to visit the exceptional site of the Mont St-Hilaire quarry, part of the Monteregian intrusive suite, which is located near Montréal, where 372 minerals are known. The site is recognized as among the top ten mineral-collecting sites in the world.

Third, for the 9th year in a row, the Université Laval - INRS-ETE Student Chapter is going to

participate to the *Journée des sciences de la Terre* held in March 2010 and sponsor a prize for the best presentation on mineral deposits.

Finally, members of the Student Chapter are planning a field trip in May 2010 to visit mineral deposits. The field trip organizing committee is considering visiting mining areas in Equator, Chile, Mexico or South Africa. A decision on the field trip location will be reached later this fall.
